## Fr. Steve's Quotes for Consideration:

This week, I would like to continue my summer theme of examining current philosophies and rules of life in our modern secular society and how they can negatively impact the practice of our faith. Over the last several weeks, we have been examining *relativism* and its detrimental effects. You may recall that the basic theory of relativism is the idea that there is no such thing as objective truths (what is right and wrong) that are applicable to all peoples of all times; rather, relativism holds that each person can determine for themselves what is right or wrong for them. This theory is dangerous, because it calls into question truths that are a part of human nature, and it makes human beings into gods, encouraging them to decide for themselves what is right and what is wrong. This is especially a dangerous philosophy for Catholics, because to be a relativist often means rejecting what Jesus Christ has revealed as truth through the Catholic Church's teachings, and doing this is always detrimental to our spiritual life.

This weekend, I would like to turn to a new modern philosophy: *hedonism*. Hedonism is a philosophy of life by which one should pursue what is pleasurable and avoid what is painful at all costs. It is the unbridled pursuit of pleasure. Now, it used to be that such persons who believed and practiced this way of life were seen as selfish by society at large. But I would argue that hedonism has currently become the lifestyle of choice in our secular society. And this is directly connected to relativism as well. Because if a person believes that they are capable and in fact have the "right" to determine what is true and good for themselves, then doesn't it make sense that when left to ourselves, we will be most easily tempted to choose what is pleasurable rather than what is painful? This is the danger of hedonism: it makes a god out of fleeting pleasures. Pleasure in itself is not bad. There are many morally good things which are accompanied by pleasure- eating a good meal, going for a swim on a hot day, sexual intimacy between spouses. But the problem with the hedonistic person is that they pursue pleasure *solely for its own sake*, and wish to avoid pain at all costs.

Now, don't get me wrong, it is morally acceptable to try to avoid excessive pain, and modern medicine has come a long way in making that possible. But sometimes, pain, difficulty, suffering are unavoidable. And for the Christian, suffering, struggle, and difficulty is not something to be avoided at all costs, but an opportunity to unite our struggles and pain with the sufferings of Jesus Christ on the Cross for the redemption of the world. It's the source of the old phrase to "offer it up." Offering our struggle, difficulty, pain and suffering to God as a prayerful sacrifice is a very powerful form of prayer. And, the reality is that Jesus said, "if anyone wishes to be my disciple, he must take up his cross daily and follow me." Jesus did not promise his disciples a life of pleasure and leisure, but rather that He would walk with us in life no matter what may come. God bless you! *Fr. Steve*
