Pastor's Note(s):

<u>Stewardship</u>: The Gospel this weekend describes the contrasting dynamics in our relationship to God and in his relationship to us. God is not a projection of our human desires. Nor does God act or behave as we would. It is not just that God is more merciful than we might be, or more forgiving. God appears not to think the way we do.

Isaiah reminds us, "As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts." God starts from a different place. Having all that is required, God's actions do not spring from need, only the need to give.

And so the calculus of God's generosity is fundamentally different to ours. It is not the calculus of human reason, but the calculus of abundant blessings and grace! Does God not expect the same of us in the stewardship of our gifts?
