Fr. Steve's Quotes for Consideration:

"I need nothing but God, and to lose myself in the heart of Jesus."

-St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690)

Today's quote comes from a great saint in France during the 17th century: St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. St. Margaret Mary was a nun of Visitation Order who worked with God's grace to bring about a widespread devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus during a time in which the Catholic faith in France was undergoing difficulty and struggle. St. Margaret suffered a lot during her short life, both from physical illness and from disbelief of her own superior about the authenticity of the visions and mystical experiences. Eventually, her prayer experiences were decided to have been authentic. She had many experiences of Jesus speaking to her about the depths of love to be found in His Sacred Heart.

In the Jewish mind, the heart was a symbol of the very core, or even the entirety of the person. And so, the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a devotion in which we honor the heart of God, revealed in the human heart of Jesus, which bled with love for us. The image of the Sacred Heart is a familiar one to most of us (the statue of our Lord in the back of Church is one of the Sacred Heart). It consists of an image of our Lord, with him pointing to or revealing his heart. His heart is crowned with thorns, is bleeding, has flames rising from it, and a cross on top of it. All of these are symbols for what our Lord Jesus endured for our salvation, and the burning love which Jesus has for each of us.

Reflection upon the depths of love that Jesus has for each one of us is truly amazing and, spiritually speaking, deeply beneficial. God's love in Jesus Christ burns with love for us, has suffered profoundly for us, and desires to unite our hearts with His. He desires so desperately to be in an intimate and personal loving relationship with us. There is a beautiful prayer found in the tradition of the Church called the "Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus," in which we ask Jesus to have mercy on us under various symbolic titles of Jesus' heart that serve to teach us about the profound depth of love, mercy, forgiveness and grace that flows from His heart. For example, Jesus' heart is referred to as "burning furnace of charity, fountain of life and charity, source of all consolation, etc." I encourage you to consider offering some prayers and spending a few moments contemplating the loving and Sacred Heart of Jesus, which burns with love for you! God bless you.
